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Executive Message

We are proud to meet an important need in our community, providing oral health care to people who, in the past, could not afford to access care. For many, inability to pay was accompanied by a sense of shame and embarrassment.

The Wright Clinic is a not-for-profit, community-based dental clinic managed by the London Community Dental Alliance (LCDA) Board of Directors. A team of dentists, dental hygienists and dental assistants, including volunteers, work collaboratively from a health equity framework to provide oral health care to individuals facing barriers, such as income or housing insecurity.

Not accessing care affects more than a person's mouth. Lack of adequate oral health care can lead to:

- Pain which can lead a person to visit a hospital or hospital emergency for relief and emergency treatment.
- Worsening of other health problems like diabetes and heart conditions.
- Socio-economic limitations such as education, employment.
- Feelings of embarrassment, lack of confidence, lower life satisfaction and quality of life.

In London and Middlesex, 29% of adults aged 20 years and older are without dental insurance, approximately 146,000 people. While some without insurance can afford to pay out of pocked, many cannot.

Another 27,000 individuals and families have inadequate coverage through social assistance. In 2021, visits to hospital emergency departments are estimated to have cost the system \$1.25 million. Three out of four visits were for non-traumatic oral health conditions – conditions which may have been prevented if people had been able to access oral health care from an oral health clinic like The Wright Clinic.

We are pleased that the federal government is implementing the Canada Dental Care Plan. We believe this Plan will help to meet some of the oral health needs and we also know that the Plan will not reach everyone that needs help accessing care. We know this Plan is still under development. There are many details that the dental community needs to better understand how the Plan will work and the impact it will have on Clinic operations. We look forward to the possibilities that the new Canada Dental Care Plan may provide for our Clinic and the community we serve.

We Thank Our Volunteers...

Our volunteers contributed a conservative estimate of \$22,000 through hours of oral health service provided in 2023.

Year in Review

2023 started with a stable and cohesive staffing team contributing to The Wright Clinic's ability to serve a growing number of clients. In 2023, The Wright Clinic served 640 people, twice as many than in 2021.

Our volunteer team grew from 7 in 2021 to 24 by the end of 2023.

The Wright Clinic was able to continue offering evening appointments with funding from Green Shield Cares.

Our partnerships with the Middlesex-London Health Unit (MLHU), Fanshawe College, Glen Cairn Community Resource Centre and volunteer dentists increase community access to care, support sustainability and build capacity among oral health providers to deliver traumainformed, supportive and quality care.

Throughout the year, 48 dental hygiene students and 34 dental assisting students from Fanshawe College contributed 1,042 hours of care and support.

Our partnership with Glen Cairn Community Resource Centre (GCRRC) continues to strengthen. Through this partnership, our clients are supported to access food and other basic needs. The Wright Clinic in partnership with Henry Schein and the London and District Dental Society hosted a seminar in November featuring five speakers and attracting 60 local dental professionals. This event provided local oral health professionals the opportunity to get Continuing Education credits. Two seminars are scheduled for 2024.

We are pleased at the success of our first lottery. All 500 tickets were sold. We thank everyone who purchased tickets and congratulate the lucky winners.

In December, with the sponsorship of Patterson Dental, we hosted our first year-end gala at the Lamplighter Inn in London. The event was a great success with 255 people attending including donors, partners, dental professionals and dental organization representatives.

Looking ahead in 2024, we will be considering how the Canada Dental Care Plan fits into The Wright Clinic model. We are hosting two continuing education seminars as well as focusing on sustainability models, volunteer and staff development and our communication strategy.

Reflections

Increasing Access to Care Through Partnership



In 2023 The Wright Clinic had 251
Ontario Seniors Dental Care Program
(OSDCP) patients on their client list.
This partnership enabled the
Middlesex-London Health Unit (MLHU)
to address the wait times for service
for the OSDCP. Additionally, MLHU
rented space in The Wright Clinic while
MLHU was building a new dental clinic
in Strathroy, allowing MLHU staff to
further address service wait times and
see even more patients.

Building the Future Workforce with Student Placements

Workforce development particularly among dental assistants is a top issue according to the Canadian Dental Association.

In 2023, 48 dental hygiene providing clients with dental hygiene care and 34 dental assistant students from Fanshawe College directly supported care to clients while achieving program competencies with a client group that presents with significant oral health problems.






